Al Interest Group

Lately it seems like AI is everywhere all the time all at once. It is obvious that AI is going to impact project managers and our careers sooner rather than later. In August the chapters board of directors approved a charter for an AI Interest Group. The group is focused on the three ways we see AI as impacting us.

- 1. Some of us will manage projects to implement AI solutions and products.
- 2. Al will be incorporated (much more than it already is) into the tools we use to do our jobs. There are well over 10 companies that specifically target project managers for users of their products, not counting the software giants like Google and Microsoft that are incorporating Al into their existing products.
- **3.** PMs will be asked to evaluate and recommend AI enhanced tools to improve the efficiency and quality of the practice of project management in their organizations.

The Chapter was created in 1979 by Jim Snyder; 10 years after the founding of PMI in 1969. The PMI Founders, and original volunteers, were Jim Snyder, Eric Jenett, Susan Gallagher, Ned Engman, and J. Gordon Davis. The tradition of volunteering has been a pillar of the organization since its inception. Thousands of volunteers have contributed over the years to build, expand, improve, and maintain the benefits and value of the Chapter.

The Volunteer of the Month Award is part of the Chapter's Volunteer Recognition Program. The goal of the program is to recognize and honor the extraordinary service of volunteers who have substantially enhanced the discipline of project management by their commitment and support. Any volunteer who is a PMI-DVC member working on, or supporting, a project recognized by the Chapter is eligible to be nominated for this award, excluding elected Board members.

The award supports the Chapter's 2023 Annual Plan Goals: Increase membership in PMI and in the Chapter; Promote educational outreach and support professional development; and, Build lasting relationships through volunteerism.

An eligible nominee for the Volunteer of the Month recognition must have actively participated as a volunteer on one or more Chapter projects during the current award year, and must be a member in good standing with both PMI and PMI-DVC, and may not have been a recipient of the Volunteer of the Year Award in the past two years.
