# **Chapter Bylaws Revision**

On March 10, 2023 we posted the proposed revised Chapter Bylaws on our website (<u>https://pmi-dvc.org/chapter-bylaws</u>) and we sent a note asking you to review them prior to a vote for approval. We are now asking you to submit a Yes or No vote to approve the Bylaws using this link: <u>2023 Bylaws Vote\_PMI DVC</u>. Voting begins on April 14 and ends 30 days later.

Aside from grammatical changes, the key points that are new in the new Bylaws are:

1. Per PMI, the position of VP Membership is designated as a Chapter Officer and sits on the Executive Committee.

2. In several places in the document we expanded our dedication to inclusiveness and non-discrimination.

3 Because of our experience with virtual meetings during the pandemic, we now designate our principal place of business as the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (previously Springfield, PA) for flexibility.

- 4. We expanded the list of purposes of the Chapter.
- 5. We can now do all voting and meeting virtually.
- 6. Candidates for the Chapter Board must sign a non-electioneering document.

The Bylaws have been reviewed and approved by PMI, and approved by the Board of Directors for a membership vote.



- 5. Create opportunities for team members to share their personal stories and experiences.
- 6. Establish clear expectations around respectful behavior and language, and immediately address any instances of discrimination or harassment.
- 7. Encourage and support employee resource groups and affinity networks.
- 8. Foster a culture of empathy and understanding, where team members are encouraged to listen and support each other.
- 9. Provide opportunities for professional development and career growth that are accessible to everyone.
- 10. Lead by example, and model the behavior and attitudes that you want to see in your team.
