# Celebrating Jim Snyder as PMI-DVC Turns 45

Jim Snyder was an ever-present figure in PMI, as an original founder, for 55 years. His enduring spirit of service to project management and PMI was shared at the PMI-DVC chapter's 45th anniversary celebration on Tuesday, April 16th at Midtown Social in Berwyn, PA.

The chapter board and its members were joined by PMI Global staff and board of directors to recognize the milestone and honor Jim. His friends and fellow members saluted Jim's enduring legacy with testimonials, anecdotes, and fun facts about PMI member #2 and its first vice president.



After time for eating and networking PMI-DVC board members, and PMI staff shared their reflections. Many speakers touched upon Jim's easy-going way he approached members, volunteers, and staff.

Ken Golkin, PMI-DVC Chapter President and Frank Gorman, Administration & Board Secretary, Vice President, talked about the first time they met Jim. Ken shared that he had never heard of project management until Jim asked him if he was a project manager. Frank provided some insight into his mutual background with Jim. Both he and Jim were originally from Baltimore and served in the military. Frank said the first time he had heard of project management and PMI was when he read some military

documents. Frank said that he was serving as the chapter's VP of Programs when working at an event when he first met Jim and asked for his PMI membership number. Frank said that Jim simply said: "I am PMI member #2."

Brantlee Underhill, PMI Chief Community Officer, shared a bit of Jim history (he pioneered PMI-DVC as one of the first chartered chapters) and character (he would regularly call customer care). Brantlee fondly recalled that Jim was as committed to his work with the <u>PMI</u>

<u>Educational Foundation (PMIEF)</u> as walking around the office with a fundraising form to purchase chocolates.

<u>Marie Hegarty, Membership & Volunteers, Vice President</u>, read a letter by former chapter member and volunteer, Kristi Baldwin, PMP, AHPP, RMP. Kristi wrote about volunteering with Jim to bring project management to Philadelphia high schools. One of those experiences



occurred in 2017-2018: "...With the help of sign language, Spanish to English translations we delivered project management concepts week after week. At the end of that program, the students successfully presented their projects, and some proud parents came to watch. It was an awesome experience. I enjoyed the look on your face when you would watch the students capture the concept of Project Management."Jim touched almost all areas of PMI as he promoted its value until the end of his life. He never took his eye off progressing PMI and its future even as a steward of its history. He left his mark on chapters, congresses, and the PMI Educational Foundation.

Woven through his experiences were his meaningful friendships and professional relationships. Like his ribbons and pins he proudly wore, he treasured his PMI relationships the most. Jim was grateful to PMI: "My memories of

PMI and the things that I cherish the most about the organization are the friendships I've made."
