Celebrate Black History Month

Black History is American History. Far too often the contributions of Black Americans have been neglected and ignored. The long march to freedom and equality begins with knowing and understanding people's origins, struggles and achievements.

Dr. Carter G. Woodson was a scholar dedicated to celebrating the historic contributions of Black Americans. While studying for his master's degree at the University of Chicago, and later, a Ph.D. from Harvard University, Woodson observed the intentional misinterpretation of people of color in all aspects of society. In 1926, he launched the celebration of Negro History Week in the second week of February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass. President Gerald Ford officially recognized Black History Month in 1976, on both the fiftieth anniversary of the first Negro History Week, and the bicentennial of the United States.

The Journey to DEI - As a person who has spent much of the past two decades traveling internationally, as an active-duty service member, veteran, and project manager, I can attest to the various challenges that come with it: delayed flights, forgotten items, and the search for clean drinking water are just a few examples. Despite these hardships, I've found that travel can also lead to unexpected benefits when it comes to diversity, equity, and inclusion. Specifically, putting boots on the ground around the world has helped me to gain a deeper understanding of the needs of others, which in turn has aided me in creating more equitable and inclusive work environments as a project manager.

The rapid acceleration of globalization in the workplace brought on by the pandemic has resulted in a greater reliance on remote teams. Being a transnational worker or digital nomad has become more common, and many people now dream of working without geographical borders. To be successful as project managers in this new reality, we must adapt and learn new ways to build and maintain inclusion within our teams, whether they are in the office, hybrid, or fully remote. This includes becoming proficient with tools like WhatsApp, WeTransfer, and WeChat, as well as understanding cultural differences such as starting the day later due to hot desert climates or dealing with frequent electrical blackouts in developing countries. If you want to improve the success of your projects, be mindful of your teams and meet them where they are instead of expecting conformity across the board.

On Saturday, January 21st a group of PMI-DVC members had the most fun possible while earning PDUs at the 2023 Philadelphia Future City Competition. The winning school for this extremely interesting event where middle-schools presented ideas on dealing with Climate Change in Future Cities was Lionville Middle School. The winning school earned a trip to Washington DC to compete in the National Championships which will be shown on Feb 21st at 2:00 pm on FutureCity.org

PMI-DVC gave awards for Excellence in Project Management to J.R. Fugett Middle School from West Chester, PA and St. Cecilia School, Philadelphia. Our volunteers were part of the over 100-volunteer team that made the event at Delaware County Community College (one of our Educational Partners) work for over 300 students representing 32 schools.
