### Juneteenth

Project managers can acknowledge Juneteenth by recognizing it as an important day in American history and taking steps to celebrate and honor its significance. Here are some ways to do so:

- Educate yourself and your team: Learn about the history and significance of Juneteenth and share that knowledge with your team. Please encourage them to do their research and learn more about the holiday.
- Celebrate the day: Consider holding a team event to celebrate Juneteenth. This could be a virtual event or an in-person gathering: have a potluck, play music, or engage in other activities celebrating African American history and culture.
- Support Black-owned businesses: Consider donating to a Black-owned company or purchasing goods or services.
- Volunteer: Consider volunteering with organizations that support the Black community.

#### **Pride Month**

Project Managers play a critical role in creating an inclusive workplace culture. With June being LGBTQ+ Pride Month, it is essential for Project Managers to acknowledge and celebrate diversity in their teams.

First and foremost, Project Managers should ensure that LGBTQ+ team members feel seen, heard, and valued. This can be done by creating an open and accepting environment where everyone can bring their whole selves to work.

In addition, Project Managers can take concrete steps to promote LGBTQ+ inclusion in their project planning and execution. This includes using inclusive language in communications and documentation, ensuring that project teams are diverse and representative, and considering the impact of project decisions on LGBTQ+ stakeholders. By acknowledging, celebrating, and honoring June for Freedom and Equality, Juneteenth, and Pride Month, project managers can promote diversity, equity, and inclusion in the workplace, positively impacting communities. As an inclusion effort throughout the project lifecycle, Project Managers can create a welcoming and supportive workplace for all team members. It is also essential to provide resources and support for employees, such as Employee Resource Groups (ERG) and access to mental health resources. Let's celebrate diversity and create a culture where everyone can thrive.

In March 2023, PMI proudly announced a collaboration between the Project Management Institute and Women of <u>Project Management® (WOPM</u>), the dedicated global community for women in the project profession. WOPM is a professional organization committed to promoting equal representation for women and women of color in the field of project management, through a supportive membership community, and tailored resources, including, mentoring, certifications, health & wellness, workshops, networking, and career opportunities that engage members during every stage of their career journey. The collaboration aims to amplify the voices of women in project management across its global community and enable more female project managers to enter or progress in the profession.

Have you read the March 2023, <u>PMI State of Women in Project Management Report</u>? The research was based on the PMI Annual Global Survey on PM to 8,313 project professionals, including 1,927 respondents who identify as female. The survey explored multiple facets of project management, including key drivers of project success, power skills, evolution of the PMO, adoption of standardized project management practices, and professional training and development.
