From the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee

Creating Winning Strategies for Positive Team Meetings, by Dontay Hilton

As companies work towards a more diverse and equitable workplace, Project Managers have an important role to play in ensuring teams leverage their unique backgrounds to promote creativity and productivity.

One way to incorporate DEI in team meetings is to lead with acceptance. This can be implemented by introducing cultural norms, such as recognizing that everyone has different work styles and strengths that should be respected. Furthermore, leading with acceptance includes having difficult conversations, addressing any microaggressions, and managing team dynamics and boundaries.

Another key strategy is utilizing diverse knowledge. Project Managers should ensure their teams tap into the diverse perspectives and experiences present in the room. This will help create

innovative ideas, generate creative solutions, and open up the conversation so that everyone feels encouraged to offer their input.

Finally, using the shared interpretation technique is a great way for Project Managers to promote participation among team members. The "Round Robin" technique is an example of this in which team members take turns explaining their ideas, assumptions, and interpretations, allowing everyone to provide feedback and understand how each individual is processing the data.

Project Managers can leverage all of these strategies to encourage DEI in their team meetings, ultimately creating an inclusive atmosphere where all members feel respected, heard, and valued.
