#### For What It's Worth

Last week I met Joshua Barnes from Process Mentors, who will be speaking on "Understanding Value Stream" Management for Digital Products" at our July 23, 2024 meeting. What might surprise some of you is that while we were in quick agreement that being on time and on budget are

important, in the end all that really matters is whether the project delivers business value. This

is not to say that meeting deadlines and staying within budget are unimportant; rather, they're only important in terms of how much they contribute to the business value of the project. We exchanged some stories about our experiences that only project managers could appreciate.
